So popular is the water becoming, that immense quantities are shipped weekly to St. Louis and other cities, where it is retailed in the drug stores by the glass or bottle. In the vicinity of the city are numerous beautiful natural caves, in many of which is deposited as fine onyx stone as the world produces, for the working of which a large manufactory is being erected. Eureka Springs is the southern terminus of the Eureka Springs Ry, 285 miles northwest of Little Rock and 18 southeast of Seligman, Mo., where the E. S. Ry joins the St. L. & S. F. Ry. It dates its settlement from 1879, and is supplied with Baptist, Catholic, Christian, Methodist and Presbyterian churches, an excellent system of public schools, a large number of good hotels and boarding houses, a bank, 8 newspapers, the *Times-Echo* (daily and weekly), the *Democrat* (daily and weekly) and the *Republican* (weekly). There is a fine auditorium, with a seating capacity of 4,000, for an inter-State summer normal, a well appointed opera house and a street railway. A company has been formed for the building of the largest sanitarium in the United States here. The company has secured 1,800 acres of land and have already expended over \$100,000 in beautifying the grounds, including an artificial lake, electric car line, driveways, etc. Population, 5,000. 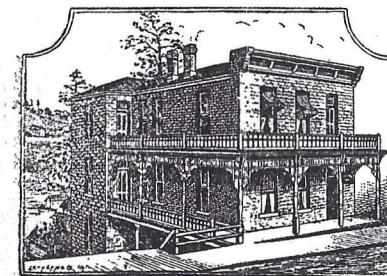
